- Incidence of pressure ulcers in hospitalized patients 2.7%-29.5% (raising concerns about identification)
- Incremental cost of care \$4,647 -\$70,000



# Patient-centered Nurse sensitive indicators (NQF-endorsed, collected by MQF)

- Percentage of patients with hospital-acquired pressure ulcer
- Number of inpatient falls per inpatient days
- Number of falls with injury
- Percentage of patients with vest or limb restraints



## MHDO/MQF initial pressure ulcer data:

- 12 hospitals with significantly higher or significantly lower incidence, or no pressure ulcers reported at all.
- Q.I. nurse engaged through Muskie co-op agreement to validate data
- Audits planned at 12 hospitals, 9 are complete (remaining 3 in August '08)
  - Findings: Inconsistent survey techniques, variation in use of specification manual, inconsistent staff training



Pressure Ulcer Summit (October 3, 2008) ("Protecting our Skins: The Pressure Is on")

- Directed at teams from hospitals and longterm care facilities
- Data driven
- Focus on standards of care
- Plan for quality improvement
- Continued measurement through Chapter 270
